Program Description

This residency will be focused on anterior segment ocular disease including cornea, glaucoma, pre/post-operative care, external disease, refractive surgery along with rotations through retina and oculoplastics. The resident will work alongside and in conjunction with InSight Vision Groups medical optometrists and fellowship trained ophthalmologists.

About InSight Vision Group

At InSight Vision Group, we are passionate about patient care and dedicated to improving quality of life through life-changing vision procedures and treatments. We strive to provide our resident with advanced training alongside our respected and highly educated optometry and ophthalmology colleagues in the fields of cornea, glaucoma, cataract, retina, oculo-plastics, and refractive surgery. We use our high-volume clinics and surgical center to immerse our resident in direct patient care to promote and teach advanced skills necessary to provide secondary and tertiary care with the highest level of diagnostic, disease management, and interprofessional communication. Ultimately, the higher level of training and scholarly development will allow the resident to provide great patient care and improved clinic outcomes.



InSight Vision Group is a private, referral-based optometry/ophthalmology practice that serves the front range of Colorado, but also has referrals from the mountain region and surrounding states. There are 5 locations on the front range spanning from Longmont, Colorado to Parker, Colorado with Boulder and Denver in between and an ambulatory surgery center in Lone Tree, Colorado. Most of the resident's time will be spent in our Denver and Parker locations. Each clinic is based on a co-management model consisting of medical optometrists and fellow trained ophthalmologists in cornea, glaucoma, and external disease.

Program Design

The residents weekly schedule will vary depending on sub-specialty clinical rotations and direct patient care schedules. The typical week on average will consist of 4.5 days in clinic and .5 days per week for education/self-guided research. Sub-specialty clinical rotation will consist of working alongside ophthalmologists and optometrists in their clinics to learn from their patient populations to include cornea, glaucoma, oculoplastics, retina, dry eye, and refractive surgery. The residents' direct care clinic will have high volume post-operative care, ocular disease, medical visits, and urgent care visits. There will always be a "back up" doctor available for consultation if needed. With our own surgical center, there are enough possibilities to observe routine and complex surgical cases across each sub-specialty. The on-call responsibility will be every other in 1-week intervals with no call taken the two weeks of Christmas and New Year's.

Educational Requirements:

- The resident will attend all in person or virtual InSight Vision Group continuing education presentations
- The resident will need to produce a "publishable" case report
- The resident will need to present a case report presentation of their choosing at an InSight Vision Group conference or for the InSight Vision Group doctors

Criteria for Completion

1. Complete all clinical rotations
2. Attend all in person or virtual IVG continuing education presentations
3. Produce a "publishable" case report
4. Present a case report presentation of their choosing at an IVG in person or virtual conference or to IVG doctors
5. Present case report at ICO Grand Rounds
6. Complete a final residency review of the program
